Also reminded to catch coughs and sneezes in tissues -Catch it, Bin it, Kill it, and to avoid touching face with unclean hands. Tissues will be available throughout the workplace Reminding everyone of the public health advice on the Government website to help reduce the spread of COVID-19 Posters, leaflets and other materials are available for display from the government website Regular checks and reminders will be carried out by line managers to ensure the necessary procedures are being followed

Social Distancing

- Reducing the number of persons in work and communal areas to comply with the 2metre (6.5 foot) gap recommended by the Government
- Taking steps to review work schedules including start & finish times, working from home etc. to reduce number of Pure employees on site at any one time
- Reviewing processes and procedures to ensure social distancing can be observed
- Conference calls to be used instead of face to face meetings unless under exceptional circumstances

Symptoms of Covid-19

- If anyone becomes unwell with any of the Covid-19 symptoms in the workplace they will be sent home and advised to follow the isolation guidance. Line managers will maintain regular contact with employees during this time
- If advised that an employee or someone an employee has come into contact with recently has developed Covid-19 symptoms, the management team will identify people who have been in contact with them and will take advice on any actions or precautions that should be taken
- Our team should not share vehicles

- Regular communication from line managers will be carried out to reassure and support employees in a fast changing situation
- Line managers will offer support to staff who are affected by Coronavirus or has a family member affected
